ORDER

To the extent that defendant's Motion to Stop Zacarias Moussaoui State Murder [sic] and Have the Right to Contact French Embassy [sic] and National Assembly (Docket #323) repeats his desire to communicate with foreign governmental entities, such as the French Parliament, it has already been addressed in a separate Order and is, therefore, DENIED as cumulative.

However, this motion also appears to contain defendant's request, as a French citizen, for a consular visit. Because defendant has never before asked this Court for leave to have any consular contacts, his assertions that the Court (or to our knowledge any United States government official) has denied him his right to consult with officials of the French Embassy are incorrect. Special Administrative Measure ("SAM") No. 3 explicitly allows for consular communications and visits subject to compliance with the United States Department of State Consular notification and access requirements.<sup>1</sup>

For these reasons, to the extent that this motion (Docket #323) requests a consular visit, it is GRANTED; and it is hereby

ORDERED that standby counsel immediately communicate this request to the French Embassy to facilitate a consular contact as soon as possible.

The Clerk is directed to forward copies of this Order to defendant, pro se; counsel for the United States; standby defense counsel; the Court Security Officer; and the United States Marshal.
